THE TAGA HONORS AWARD

for Outstanding Contributions to the Graphic Arts Industry

The Technical Association of the Graphic Arts (TAGA) was organized in 1948 as a forum for reporting on new research and technology in the graphic arts. It has a distinguished history of annual conferences at which papers on technical graphic arts subjects are presented. TAGA Proceedings is the published record of these papers by leading technical and scientific men and women who have contributed measurably to the progress of printing technology and graphic science throughout the world. The Board of Directors of TAGA hereby recognized the endeavors of two more members of the graphic arts scientific community by selecting them for the TAGA Honors Award. We hope that all members of TAGA and people throughout the graphic arts industry will join in congratulating these men on their achievements.

As evidence of this honor, each awardee will receive the TAGA Honors symbol. This was designed in 1976 by R. E. Maurer, then president of TAGA, and consists of a spire with three transparent side panels in the subtractive primary colors, yellow, magenta and cyan, which are the colors of the three dye layers in transparencies and the colorants used in the printing inks for process-color reproduction. The overlap colors of red, green, and blue (violet) are generated by the colored panels. The black base represents the black printer and the white base of the pyramid the printing paper.

Presented, in alphabetical order, are the two distinguished recipients of the 1982 TAGA Honors Award.

TAGA HONORS AWARD 1982

to

HERBERT E. PHILLIPS

for his dedication to research and education of technical and production personnel in the industry through the organization of seminars and workshops at R.I.T. and in the field; and for his generous contributions of time and service to TAGA as Secretary-Treasurer for seven consecutive terms, TAGA honors Herbert E. Phillips.



Herbert E. Phillips, Director, Technical and Education Center of the Graphic Arts (formerly Graphic Arts Research Center), Rochester Institute of Technology (R.I.T.) joined R.I.T. in 1955, became Assistant Department Head in 1960, and was named Director in 1965. Herb ably guided the department through many changes and innovations. He directed the move from the crowded downtown quarters to the new Henrietta campus. He has managed the research and development activities of distinguished scientists and technologists and under his direction numerous printing quality control devices have been developed and distributed.

His most notable achievements have been in the area of technical training and education where a wide variety of seminars and workshops has been organized and implemented which have attracted registrants from around the world. In addition, the Technical and Education Center has completely updated commercial equipment like the web press which has been used not only for teaching and demonstration but also by manufacturers of papers, inks, plates, and other supplies for testing and trial runs which have led to new and improved products for the industry.

Herb attended the University of Maine and graduated from R.I.T. in 1952 with a degree in photographic technology. He is a member of the Executive Committee of the Research and Engineering Council of the Graphic Arts, the Graphic Arts Committee of the Technical Association of the Pulp and Paper Industry, the International Association of Research Institutes for the Graphic Arts Industry, and of TAGA which he has served as Secretary-Treasurer for 13 years.

The Technical Association of the Graphic Arts congratulates Herb on his contributions to the industry and thanks him for his dedication to the industry's research and education and its associations, especially TAGA.
